

**PRESS RELEASE**  
**IOWA BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS**  
**(June 6, 2006)**

Recently, the Iowa Board of Medical Examiners took the following action:

**Basavalinga S. Ajaikumar, M.D.**, a 54 year-old physician who formerly practiced oncology in Burlington, Iowa, entered into a Settlement Agreement with the Board to resolve pending disciplinary charges. Dr. Ajaikumar has not lived in, or practiced medicine in Iowa since 2000. Dr. Ajaikumar was charged with professional incompetency and practice harmful or detrimental to the public. Under the terms of the Iowa Settlement Agreement, Dr. Ajaikumar voluntarily surrendered his Iowa medical license.

**Harry M. Condoleon, D.O.**, a 40 year-old general surgeon from Atlantic, Iowa, entered into a combined Statement of Charges and Settlement Agreement with the Board to resolve a pending disciplinary matter. The Board charged Dr. Condoleon with failing to conform to the minimal standard of acceptable and prevailing practice of medicine in his surgical practice. Under the terms of the Settlement Agreement, Dr. Condoleon was placed on probation subject to certain terms and conditions and he must successfully complete a Board-approved remediation plan with an educational preceptor.

**Narinder Kumar, M.D.**, a 53 year-old pediatric physician from Davenport, Iowa, entered into a combined Statement of Charges and Settlement Agreement with the Board to resolve a pending disciplinary matter. The Board charged Dr. Kumar with engaging in unprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine. Under the terms of the Settlement Agreement, Dr. Kumar was placed on probation for a period of five years subject to certain terms and conditions for substance abuse monitoring, he must have a female chaperone present when treating female patients and he must complete a Board-approved prescribing course.

**Samir R. Wahby, M.D.**, a 45 year-old orthopedic surgeon from Fort Dodge, Iowa, entered into a Settlement Agreement with the Board to resolve pending disciplinary charges. On June 24, 2005, Dr. Wahby entered into a Physician Health Contract with the Iowa Physician Health Program for substance abuse monitoring. On March 2, 2006, the Board charged Dr. Wahby with violating the terms of the Physician Health Contract. Under the terms of the Settlement Agreement, Dr. Wahby was placed on probation for a period of five years subject to certain terms and conditions for substance abuse and anger management, he must also pay a \$5,000 civil penalty and he must complete a Board-approved anger management assessment.

**Mohammad Yaseen, M.D.**, a 50 year-old pediatric gastroenterologist from the Quad Cities, had formal disciplinary charges filed against him. On May 31, 2006, the Board charged Dr. Yaseen with engaging in a pattern of professional incompetency in the practice of medicine. A hearing on the charges is scheduled for August 18, 2006.
